## *2012 - THE YEAR OF THE DRAGON*

New Year... What does it mean for you? I associate it with New Year's tree, Santa Claus, tangerines and of course presents. Every December we prepare to it. Every year we dress different new and smart clothes. We celebrate this holiday in different places and with various group of people. All the people love New Year's Night so much. We have different customs and traditions around it. Sometimes we read horoscopes and try to guess what is going to be in the future.

Do you know the symbol of the 2012? According to the Chinese Zodiac, the Year of 2012 is the Year of the Dragon, which begins on January 23, 2012 and ends on February 9, 2013. The Dragon is the fifth sign of the Chinese Zodiac, which consists of 12 Animal signs. The Dragon is a creature of myth and legend. In ancient China, the celestial Dragon represents an emperor and power. Today, it is the ultimate auspicious symbol signifying success and happiness. May the celestial Dragon bring great good luck to everyone!

In Sung Dynasty (a Chinese imperial dynasty lasting from AD 960 - 1279) texts, the dragon is described as having the head of an ox, muzzle of a donkey, eyes of a shrimp, horns of a deer, body of a serpent covered

with fish scales, and feet of a phoenix. The dragon usually clutches a pearl symbolic of its super-natural powers. Invariably accompanied by thunder and rain, dragons move like lightning and whirlwinds - all powerful yet totally unpredictable.

Moreover the next year is a leap year (or intercalary or bissextile year) is a year containing one extra day in order to keep the calendar year synchronized with the astronomical or seasonal year. Because seasons and astronomical events do not repeat in a whole number of days, a calendar that had the same number of days in each year would, over time, drift with respect to the event it was supposed to track. By occasionally inserting (or intercalating) an additional day or month into the year, the drift can be corrected. A year that is not a leap year is called a common year.

# Travelling around the world

## Christmas abroad

### *How Finland Celebrates Christmas...*



Four years ago I travelled to Finland with my pupils. We went there in winter, so we had a great chance to find out how Finnish celebrate Christmas and New Year! We began our travelling on the 2nd of January. We gathered on Sverdlovsk railway station and left Yekaterinburg for St.Petersburg. Our travelling by train was very interesting and funny. All the pupils, their parents and teachers took an active part in different competitions, doing crosswords and telling funny stories. Everybody was happy, because we were waiting for wonder, dreaming about Christmas and New Year in Finland - unusual and unforgettable country! And our dreams became true!

I'd like to tell some words about how Finnish see Christmas and New Year in.

Everybody's house is given a very good clean in readiness for Christmas. Hours are spent in the kitchen cooking and baking special treats for the festive season. Fir trees are felled, tied onto sleds, and taken home to be decorated. A sheaf of grain is often tied to a pole, together with nuts and seeds and placed in the garden for the birds. Many of the peasants will not eat their Christmas dinner until the birds have had their dinner.

The meal was begun as soon as the first star appeared in the sky. In Finland the Christmas tree is set up on Christmas Eve. Apples and other fruits, candies, paper flags, cotton and tinsel are used as decorations, and candles are used for lighting it.

The Christmas festivities are preceded by a visit to the famous steam baths, after which everyone dressed in clean clothes in preparation for the Christmas dinner, which is served at 5-7 in the evening.

Christmas gifts may be given out before or after the dinner. The children do not hang up stockings, but Santa Claus comes in person, often accompanied by as many as half a dozen Christmas elves to distribute the presents. The main dish of the dinner is boiled codfish served snowy white and fluffy, with all-spice, boiled



potatoes, and cream sauce. The dried cod has been soaked for a week in a lye solution, then in clear water to soften it to the right texture. Also on the menu is roast suckling pig or a roasted fresh ham, mashed potatoes, and vegetables.

After dinner the children go to bed while the older people stay up to chat with visitors and drink coffee until about midnight.

Christmas Day services in the churches begin at six in the morning. It is a day for family visits and reunions. In some parts of the country the Star Boys tour the countryside singing Christmas songs. During all these days the people keep wishing each other a "Merry Yule."

December 13 is the day of Saint Lucia, who is celebrated with lots of candles and formal celebrations in every town with a candle-crowned young girl. The time for Scandinavian Christmas tree shopping and decorating is coming, and Christmas cards are being exchanged. Essentials on Christmas Eve in Finland are Christmas mass, and a visit to a Finnish sauna of course. Many Finnish families also visit cemeteries to remember the dead and have porridge for lunch (with a hidden almond in it - the finder has to sing a song.)


Christmas in Finland officially ends 13 days after Christmas Day.

### **What do you know about Christmas?**

# Exams

## *How to write an essay?*

### Brief Overview of the 10 Essay Writing Steps

**Define the context.** If the essay is assigned, certain parameters will usually be defined for you, such as the length of the essay, format of the title page, and the intended audience and what length is appropriate. No matter what, if you're given directions, follow them. Remember, the main point is what you should concentrate on. Stick to the question key words throughout your essay.

**Choose a topic.** Often this will be decided for you, but if not, try to choose something you're interested in or, better yet, passionate about. It will make the essay easier to write. On the other hand you could choose a stand you disagree with because it will allow you to see flaws in your argument more easily. You can also think of your thesis statement at this point, but it shouldn't be set in stone since it may be elaborated or changed as you do your research in the next step. A thesis statement is what your essay is attempting to explain and prove.

**Gather your information.** Whether it's personal observations or scientific facts, you'll need evidence to back up your thesis statement. Take detailed notes, keeping track of which facts come from which sources. As you're researching your topic, don't ignore facts and claims that seem to disprove your thesis statement. A good essayist includes the contrary evidence and shows why such evidence is not valid.

**Plan your essay.** This is the time to solidify your thesis statement. Look over all of your research and notes: Can you observe any patterns or observations? Try making a mind map to organize your thoughts.

**Write the body of your essay first.** Identify three or more points that support and/or explain your thesis statement. Each point should be supported by specific evidence, examples or arguments. Use your outline as a guide, presenting the information in full sentences that flow logically from one to the next.

**Conclude your essay.** Summarize your points and suggest ways in which your conclusion can be thought of in a larger sense. What are the implications of your thesis statement being true? What's the next step? What questions remain unanswered? You should only be "repackaging" what you already discussed, using a broader perspective.

**Write the introduction.** Now that you've written the body and the conclusion, you're in the best position to tell the reader what they're getting into. Explain your thesis statement, and how you're going to affirm it, without being too specific. One approach is to begin with a general statement, then follow it with a question or problem, then with your thesis statement, and a brief overview of your points.

**Read through your essay.** For now, don't worry about typos or grammatical errors; underline them so you can go back and fix them later. Go from start to finish to see how your essay flows. Does each sentence lead smoothly to the next? Does each paragraph flow logically to the next? Each statement should be connected or related somehow to the one before it, not thrown randomly together.

**Revise, revise, revise!** Writing the paper the first time is not the most important part of writing an essay—revision is! Sometimes the paper you write is not the essay you originally planned. It is difficult to accomplish all that one sets out to in a paper, and sometimes you may find that your ideas about your subject have changed as you've been writing. Make sure you're happy with the way your paper presents its points. Don't like it? Rearrange it.

**Proofread.** Now check for spelling and/or grammatical errors. If using a word processor's spell checker, remember that it only checks to see if a word is misspelled. For example, if you meant to use the word "write" and instead used "writ" the spell checker will pass it without noticing, since 'writ' is an actual word. Pick out any repetitive words. Avoid using colloquial (informal) writing. Use English pronunciation correctly.

Robert Downey, Jr. and Jude Law reprise their roles as Sherlock Holmes and Dr. John Watson. Holmes and Watson join forces to outwit and bring down their most cunning adversary, Professor Moriarty, played by Jared Harris.

The film is specifically influenced by Conan Doyle's work "The Final Problem", but it is an independent story rather than a strict adaptation. Actions take place in 1891 around Europe is a series of mysterious attacks and killings. Holmes believes that behind all this, Professor James Moriarty - mathematical genius, the author of famous lectures and papers, "Napoleon of the criminal world". Irene Adler (Rachel McAdams) delivers a package to Dr. Hoffmanstahl - payment for a letter he was to deliver. Hoffmanstahl opens the package, triggering a hidden bomb which is prevented from detonating by the intervention of Sherlock Holmes. Holmes takes the letter and disposes of the bomb while Adler and Hoffmanstahl escape. Holmes later finds Hoffmanstahl assassinated. Adler meets with Professor Moriarty to explain the events, but



Moriarty poisons her—deeming her position compromised by her love for Holmes. This is the beginning of the film. Filming started in October 2010. Most of the scenes filmed in London in January 2011, the film crew moved into the neighborhood of Richmond, where the residence of Hampton Court, and continued shooting the film. In addition, in September the same year the picture was shot in the Greenwich Hospital.

I advise everyone to watch this film. Enjoy it!
